The Stanbridge Academic Program

- Rigorous course of study that is responsive to the academic needs of each student
- Aligns with California state standards
- Inspires intellectually-curious, academically-oriented learners
- Course offerings include trigonometry, calculus, chemistry, computer science, and four grade levels of writing and literature
- Prepares students for college and an appropriate postsecondary environment
- Development of executive function incorporated into all aspects of our curriculum

The core focus of the Stanbridge High School program is an academic course of study culminating in a diploma. Beginning in ninth-grade, our college & career counselor helps students and their families work toward achieving their postsecondary goals.

A Program Built for Postsecondary Success

Approximately 75% of all Stanbridge graduates continue their academic careers at a four-year or two-year college, university, or vocational school.

Our graduates have also enrolled in residential education programs (such as Fresno State's *Wayfinders*, and Foothill College's *Tools for Transition and Work*) while others have joined the workforce.
